Dear Colonel Rush:

The Environmental Protection Agency has reviewed your plans for placement of dredged material for the Lake Pontchartrain, Louisiana, and Vicinity Hurricane Protection Project, as described in your Public Notice dated November 29, 1974, and your Statement of Findings dated August 22, 1975.

Your disposal plans for the Chalmette, New Orleans East, and the Barrier Units are approved, on the condition that the St. Charles portion of the project be eliminated completely. Although the project will have adverse effects on wetlands in the New Orleans East and Chalmette Units, these areas have been at least partially leveed for some time. The St. Charles area, however, has not been leveed and we believe that destruction of these wetlands is not warranted. We also make the following recommendations on the disposal of dredged material:

- 1. To the maximum extent feasible, tidal interchange should be allowed into the New Orleans East area until developed areas are threatened.
 - The Seabrook Lock should be constructed as soon as possible in in order to reduce salt water intrusion into Lake Pontchartrain.

We appreciate the opportunity to review your dredged material disposal clans, and we will be happy to discuss these comments further if you so desire.
